

Top 5 incidents leading to auto claims and how your drivers can avoid them



Accidents can happen to the most experienced drivers, leading to insurance claims and creating a need for costly overtime in the event a driver is injured. As a DSP owner, there are steps you can take to ensure your drivers are doing everything they can to avoid some of the biggest hazards on the roadways. Start by using this guide to educate them on the top 5 types of incidents leading to auto claims for Amazon DSPs over a multi-year period – along with best practices they can follow to help prevent them.

1. SIDESWIPE/LANE CHANGE

47% of auto claims are caused by sideswipes when a vehicle is changing lanes.*

HOW TO AVOID THEM: Be aware of lane restrictions and remember to create a complete picture around you when merging into traffic or making a lane change.

Check your mirrors:

- Before you change lanes
- After you have signaled
- Right after you start the lane change
- After you complete the lane change

2. REAR-END COLLISION

23%

of auto claims are caused by rear-end collisions.*

HOW TO AVOID THEM: Remove distractions, keep a safe following distance, and always slow down when weather conditions are poor.

3. COLLISION IN INTERSECTION

of auto claims are caused by accidents occurring in intersections.*

HOW TO AVOID THEM:

As you approach an intersection:

- Anticipate (light changes, actions of the vehicle ahead of you, movement of pedestrians and cross traffic)
- Keep your distance
- Cover the brake

As you proceed through an intersection:

• Practice the 3-second rule for safety and visibility (wait 3 seconds after the vehicle in front of you proceeds, or after the light changes if you're the first vehicle in line)



4. PARKING/ENTERING TRAFFIC

of auto claims are caused by accidents occurring while parking or entering traffic.*

HOW TO AVOID THEM:

Manage distractions: Lower your windows, turn off your radio, and remain focused both before and while backing up.

• Remember: You should never use your cell phone while on the route - especially while parking or entering traffic.

Use your mirrors: Check all your mirrors for vehicles, equipment, pedestrians, obstructions, and/ or other hazards.

Use your equipment: If you have to back up, sound your horn before executing your backing maneuver and activate your hazard flashers (and beacons if equipped) to communicate your intentions.

Think ahead: If you have to back up, set yourself up for success by parking away from heavy traffic and using open spaces where you can use the pull-through parking method.

5. HEAD-ON COLLISION


